National data collected by the British Hedgehog Preservation Society and Peoples' Trust for Endangered Species indicate that there is an estimated 1 million animals remaining, down from 30 million hedgehogs in the 1950's.

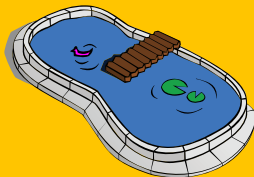

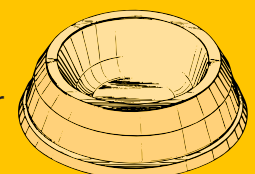

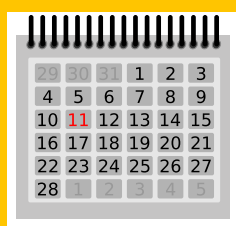
